# This month's recipe

# Perfect for festive dinner. Apple pie flowers

## [Ingredients] Serves 4

- A. 1/2 Apple (cored)
- B. 2 TBS Sugar
- C. 1 Heaped TBS Coconut oil
- D. Cinnamon powder as needed
- E. Pastry sheets (bought ones or handmade) as needed

### [Method]

- 1. Cut (A) thinly in a half moon shape
- In microwave safe bowl, place (1), B.C.D, use cling wrap and heat in microwave (roughly 500W) for about 2~3 minutes.
  - Make sure it's not too soft, we don't want to lose the shape of the apple.
- 3. Let (2) to cool down.
- 4. Cut (E) with 1~2 cm thickness with roughly 40cm in length.
- 5. Arrange each apple slices (3) lengthwise on (4) overlapping each other.

# Trivia for the month Health benefits of Apples

Health benefits of Apples
"An apple a day keeps the doctor away" is a well-known English proverb that most of us have heard before. "Quercetin" is an antioxidant contained in mostly red apples which is full of disease-fighting compounds. It also reduces cholesterol levels, reduces risks of cancer and so much more positive health benefits of this particular super fruit.



- 6. Gently from the end of (5) roll it up and use egg yolk (as a glue agent) or toothpick to hold its shape.
- 7. Preheat oven to 200 degrees. Bake (6) for 13~15 minutes.
- 8. Take out the toothpick once cooked and it's complete\*!
- \*After baking brush the apple flower petals with melted jam and it will look extra rosier!





# What is the typical **Christmas sweets??**



Round sponge cake frosted with whipped cream and "bûche de Noël" are the typical Christmas sweets in Japan, but here in Europe, Christmas sweets vary from country to country and from region to region. Have a good look at a bakery or sweets shop. You may find Christmas sweets which can't be seen in Japan.

### Bledele

Alsatian pastry. It contains dill, almonds, lemon peel etc.

# Gugelhupf(Kugelhopf)

Austrian, Swiss, German and Alsatian cake. It contains almond and Kirsch liquor.

Traditional German Christmas sweets. It is a heavy bread stuffed with nuts and dried fruit. It lasts long so people can start eating from November.

### **Panettone**

Traditional Italian sweets. It contains raisins, orange and dried fruits. It lasts almost half a year.
